**Te Ara Marire - House Names and Colours**

This school tohu / crest, Te Ara Marire, was designed and developed after the merging of North Clyde school with Wairoa Primary. The symbolic patterns relate to local maunga, the awa and moana. Our school house groups are included in the tohu and each child that enrolls is given a 'House Group and Colour.' The houses are as follows: Waiora | Red House Wairoa | Blue House Waiope | Yellow House Wainui | Green House

During most school events tamariki are encouraged to wear their House Colours with pride and participate in everything so they can gain points for their house – the winner house is given a big treat at the end of every term and a REALLY BIG treat at the end of the year if they've achieved the most points. It really is a lot of fun hearing and seeing the kids participating but also competing in different sports and learning activities (e.g. The Junior Flower Show and Library Learning).

**Fun Swimming Day**

Our Fun Swimming Day was temporarily disrupted last Friday so we carried on today. As you can see from the photos, most students wore their house colours before changing into their togs – this meant teachers could give out house points to those that dressed up, whilst others gained points on the Water Slide by collecting as many blocks as they could. **Earthquake | Tsunami Procedures**

Last week's alert was an opportunity for us to revisit and share our procedures with whanau. Hopefully we never have to perform an actual evacuation but conducting 'practice drills' is very important. We do this at the beginning of every year, especially for new tamariki. On Monday, March 15<sup>th</sup> between 9 and 10 am we will conduct our Tsunami Evacuation drill. The route that we take is on our Website, Facebook Page and attached to this panui. **Enrolments to now include Pepeha**

**Pepeha** is a way of introducing yourself in Māori. It tells people who you are by sharing your connections with the people and places that are important to you.

With enrolments coming in from all over the motu | country and world | te ao, it is important for our new tamariki to feel connected to their turangawaewae – their special place (e.g. iwi, hapu, town). In addition to our students learning their pepeha in class, we will now include a 'Pepeha Form' which will be completed when students enrol. This may change as they move through the years, especially if whanau delve deeper into their whakapapa. We think this is a great addition to our enrolment and will develop pride in oneself.

#### What is Skinny Jump?

Skinny Jump is a flexible prepaid wireless broadband service. Ciena and the Spark Foundation have teamed up to sponsor Jump for selected homes. This means your family could be eligible for free broadband for the entire school year.

#### What is the Ciena Jump for Students Fund?

The Ciena Jump for Students Fund is intended for students who don't have a current connection at home. Ciena Jump helps students to get a broadband connection to study and learn.

\*You will get free broadband until the end of December 2021. After this you will have the option to sign up to standard Skinny Jump which is \$5 for 30GB.  
**You will still need a device and a fibre connection to use the Broadband.**

**This is for families who currently don't have broadband at home, or are already using Skinny Jump**

#### How do I sign up?

**Forms at the Office**

Fill in the form on the reverse and return it to your school leader. If you're eligible, your school leader will give you a modem. They will then talk you through the set up process and what you can do to stay safe online and manage your data.

#### Already have Jump?

You can still be a part of the Ciena Jump for Students Fund. This means you will no longer need to pay for Jump. Talk to your school leader about switching your plan.
